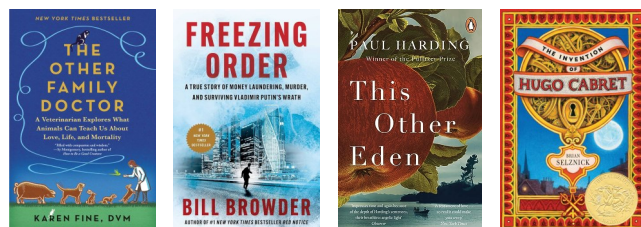

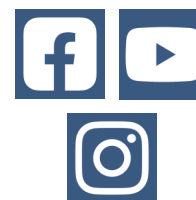

Full of audience participation.



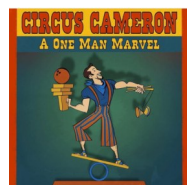
### Family Art

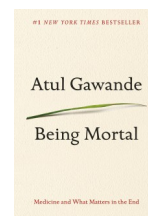
### Fiber Arts Meet Up
